



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
THE CASTING DIRECTOR ELEANOR COOKE

From what I've seen-she has an excellant eye for type and ability--and she's not adverse to working with an actor above and beyond the call of duty. CASE IN POINT + for the role of 'Joseph'(the young boy) in "Wallenberg" she searched for quite some time-weeks. When she finally found him he spoke lines in English, ... phonetically!

Mrs. Cookeris also one of the most personable casting people I've met. She cares a lot: Indeed, I think she loves her craft.

Her husband is a director (film/tv) and if he is anything like her the entire process of his films from casting (we're told they sometimes work toget ther), through creating and building a character, to late nights on location should be a joy.

- J: Why do you think he's so special?
- R: The way He did it. He'd take a joke, figure out how to make it straight, then make it funny again. Seller's had such a beautifully simple way of doing it. Start at a mirror with a face, Add a voice and a character. Build from there. He'd do it ass-backwards. I love that.
- J: Did he ever do standup?
- P. Not in the sense that we do standup here in America. He did some comedy British monologues in character.
- J: In a lot of your standup work you play different characters and narrate as yourself. Do you think you'll ever do as Peter did and work a single character for a whole piece?
- R: Whhh-Eventually maybe, but right now I've got too many bits to lot that. I like to spread my cards out to give 'em a look at each one right now.
- J: You mentioned a moment ago that you like to trade jokes. We trade jokers.
- R: There's an endless array of artwork on those things. Some border

- R: (cont.)on the demonic, 'Comedians from Hell'. I hear you can hire Caesar Romero to come to your house and actually be the Joker for you.

 He'll put pancake make-up over his mustache.
- J: Do you have any remarks on the Comedy community--or comics in particular??
- R: I run into both kinds of comics; honorable, dignified comics, and guys thatwould rob you as soon as look at you and admit it right in your face. There are some comics that come in purely on a gimic, and they have to be unscroupulous because there's no other way for them to make it. They trample everyone, make as much money as possible, fast, and open a chain of restaurants. There are other comics that are VERY professional and will tell someone "Hey, do you know that's Leno's bit?" and then tell Leno about it.
- J: How do you feel when another comedian uses your bits?
 - R: I can ask them not to, If they say no, I can't stop them. If it happened to be one of those synchronicity things where they've come up with the same bit on their own there's nothing you can say without looking like a scumbag yourself. If someone has a reputation for being a theif, and

the they steal from you, they have to be dealt with accordingly. But it's such a grey line----a very vague area.

- J: What advice can you give to aspiring comedians and fooles?
- R: If you're smart, get into an improv class. Take comedy improvisation. That was invaluable to me, the best thing that's happened to me, trainingwise, so far. I write ON stage now.

Ric Overton can be found regularly performing at the Improvisation and at Igby's. He's also appeared in Beverly Hills Cop', 'Young Doctors in Love' 'The Road Show' (with John Candy) and, of course, in Greg Travis (his writing partner)'s video shorts which can be seen at the Lhassa Club.

He is a vegetarian, used to live in Forrest Hills, and of course, is a LEO.

RENAISSANCE REVIEWS

Well, it is that time of year again. Time for the Last' annual Renaissance Taire (only this time they haven't annual that this is the last one that MUST say something, though I'm not sure exactly what).

The quality over-all is better than it has been in the recent past. The worst stuff is gone. "Alas, so is the best, But we are ahead in the long run. The worst' were abundant... the best were few.

Anyway, after spending a couple of funfilled days there I noticed that in spite of its age (23 years) the faire seems to be going through growing pains: --maybe a 'transition'. What it may come down to is that a new generation is taking to over, so ph one hand we have a certain freshness, and on the other. a clear lack of experienced environmental performers.

This brings me to my major compliant re. the 'Ren' Faire this year (and most years). It seems that the bridge between the centuries has not been successfully crossed. I think the problem lies in the youth of the performers in respect to the faire. They seem to have been taught the Basic Faire Accent. I con't know about this year, but in years passed it was overdrilled into you that you MUST MUST use & F.A. at all times!! This is 'meet and right' TO A DEGREE. There is a point that you must realize that you are performing for a 20th century audience. That 20th century audience needs to be incorpored ated, by the performer, into the fabric of the 16th century and it cannot be done by relating to him EXCLUSIVELY within a 16th century frame of reference.

B.F.A. addiction is only a small part of the problem. The larger part is that there is frightfully little interaction. There is no doubt that pretty costumes, correct to the period, are good to see, but every person who attends the faire should ideally come home with a feeling of having been a PART of the time, not just having watched it. In the two days that I attended the faire I was not accosted once by man, woman, or beast (aside from those that I already knew) for any reason. That has always been one of the best things in experiencing the faire. The fact that you can talk, argue, laugh and haggle with people of the 16th century is part of the fantasy. With no interaction between the two groups (16th cent. & 20th cent.) it becomes a spectator sport and not as much fun for either side.

Enough of this... There's one thing I'm pleased to note--- That the crafts have impressed me (and others) for years and did not disappoint me this time. I noted several new appearances. Often they were new things made by craftspeople from previous years such as CLIMAX CERAMICS (Dan & Laurie).

Every year CLIMAX comes to the faire with something new, period compatable, and different. Whether it's new glazes or the Salami dell Amore, or this years Ceramic wolf masks and candle holders with cast child figures, their work is always unique, and quality ant as well as craft.

Also worth noting is the work of Geno who sells engraved brass and rosewood pendants. His work is Excellent and he's a character, to boot. His newest (cont. next page)

I do think, however that the 'new' castmembers could be brouder.



I arrived at the Beverly Theater at around 7:00 p.m. on Saturday the 22nd. The Blues started at 7.30 and for the next 3 hours, 3 greats and their separate bands play them to their fullest. The first set, Albert King and his band came out and the the audience moved slow and methodically to the old Blues player's rustic electric guitar Blues. The second set, Boby "Blue" Bland walked onstage with his band and proved that he could still sing the Blues as well as or better than most.
